• Grass Cutting: Castlelyons Community Council wish to clarify the position regarding cutting green areas in the Tidy Towns Area. Up to earlier this year we along with many other communities enjoyed to privilege of having out green areas cut by Cork County Council. Unfortunately earlier this year it was decided to cease this much appreciated work due to financial pressure on Cork Co. Co. We were then left with the problem of cutting all these areas, which include Bridesbridge riverbank, Hillside View Green, Kent Tce, Stables Cross to Kearney Bros, the Village Park and Spuree Cross. We are indebted to David O' Hara who cut the grass from Stables Cross to Kearney Bros on a once off voluntary basis. The local Fas Scheme came on board and are doing the rest of the grass cutting, with Castlelyons Community Council funding the petrol, we may have to revert to volunteerism for the grass cutting going forward, as the spend on petrol will be enormous if we were to try to continue that way into late September. We would like to take this opportunity to clarify the situation with regard to "Berry Hill" estate. WE really appreciate the great effort being put in by residents here in maintaining their beautiful estate, the Community Council would prefer to include this area in there grass cutting but there is a problem that at the present moment Berry Hill is considered a Private Estate. This is because Berry Hill was built privately by a developer, as we know half way through the development the housing crash began and work ceased. Fas staff are not allowed to carry out Community work on private property. At present efforts are being made to have the estate taken into the care of Cork Co. Co. Members of the Community Council are liaising with local Councillors regarding this matter. We feel that these effort will be successful and we ask the residents of Berry Hill to be patient with us, as our hands are tied until such time as the estate is signed over to the custody of Cork Co.
