Every best wish from Castlelyons Community Council and indeed the whole community is extended to local jockeys Coleman Sweeney and James Fenton who are hoping for success at this prestigious event. Punters, would be punters and non-punters will definitely have an interest in this race meeting and putting a few bob on. It is a proud moment for the Parish to see two of its sons ride at Cheltenham. Coleman Sweeney will be riding "Salsify" in the Fox Hunters Chase. This horse is owned by his mother Joan and trained by his father Rodger. WAIT FOR IT......there could be history in the making, no jockey has ever won this race three times, and this week Coleman is going for the treble!!! So best wishes to Coleman, Niamh and all the Sweeney family. Don't miss it Fri start time 4pm. Another local man James Fenton will ride "Rosie's Lady" in the St. Patrick's Derby at the festival. He is riding in aid of "Cancer Research UK". This flat race takes place over one mile and five furlongs on Thursday March 14th it is run as the seventh race of the day. This is a big day for James to ride at Cheltenham and for a very very worthy cause, every best wish to James, Joanne and all the Fenton family.
- "Smile your on camera" Due to several episodes of dog fouling at the park, especially on the walkway it was only a matter of time before drastic action had to be taken. Spy cameras have been installed in the hope of stopping this happening in the park, wireless cameras relaying visual activity to a screen are being recorded, there is no excuse for this activity as all dog owners are well aware that it is their responsibility to clean up after their dogs and the necessary bags are very cheap. It is also a problem on the footpath from Castlelyons Village to Stables Cross, please......consider other pedestrians and children using this footpath or any other public amenity. Where necessary acts of blatantly ignoring the policy regarding dog fouling will be brought to the attention of the necessary authorities.
- We are delighted to announce that Traffic Calming will become a reality in Castlelyons shortly. The Community Council have been lobbying for this for years, and their persistence has eventually paid off. Traffic through the village has been a worry for parents and pedestrians for a long time, especially with the amount of footfall in the Community Centre and G.A.A. Grounds area and McNamaras Shop. Along with this great news there is also good news on other fronts for the Village and Berry Hill area. A letter from Mr. Brendan O' Gorman B.E. states that funding has been secured for Blacktop surfacing in the Village core, that will include drainage upgrade on the Berry Hill road and around the four cross roads. The road surface will finish off the road edge on this road also. As part of the resurfacing substantial Tarmac ramps will be constructed at a number of locations on the Main Street adjacent to the Community Centre and on the Berry Hill Road. It is also hoped that funding may also be secured to improve footpaths around the Village core to complement the road surfacing. All this work will commence around May/June period. This is great news for the Village, visitors and participants to the Community Centre or Pitch, locals and pedestrians. All will feel safer because of these measures, as will all this work have an impact on appearance for the Tidy Towns Competition. "Everything comes to those who wait".
- "Return to your Home" Festival Last Friday night at the Community Centre saw a crowd of over 50 people turning up to collect and distribute their questionnaires for the parish publication "Castlelyons Parish & Environs Home History 2013". Neilus O Flynn (chairman) gave a very detailed presentation of the logistics of the project and how it will benefit the entire community as well as parishioners who have long left the parish. A page of how the book might look was given to each distributor so that people could appreciate the finished product. A word of thanks to all our distributors for their co-operation in producing this book. At a time when our young (and not so young) people are living all over the world, the importance of having roots, somewhere you can call home, a sense of place, an identity for each of our parishioners, was never so important and hopefully this parish publication will go some way to achieving that.
